 - What stands out to you about Lucy?
 - iv. Why do you think all these people did what they did? Were they just being nice, were the being obedient to a scripture in the Bible, were they following a calling from God?
 - d. On pg. 164 Francis says, "I hope these life stories have done more than encourage you; I hope they have eliminated every excuse for not living a radical, love-motivated life. I hope they have challenged the multitudes who "feel called to the rich" and ignore the poor. If biblical examples seen unattainable, hopefully, these average everyday people you hope that you, too, can live a life worth writing about."
 - i. Do these stories encourage and motivate you?
- 4. Watch video #9
- 5. What would/will you do to get your life story written about (not that that is the goal!)?
